Florida Insurance Commissioner Kevin McCarty recently has acknowledged that the state may have underestimated the impact the credits would have on insurers' income. RMS will explore methodologies in which individual insurance companies can evaluate their underwriting guidelines, data capture and rating plans to proactively deal with this situation, while also actively promoting the adoption of measures to reduce property losses via risk-based pricing.
